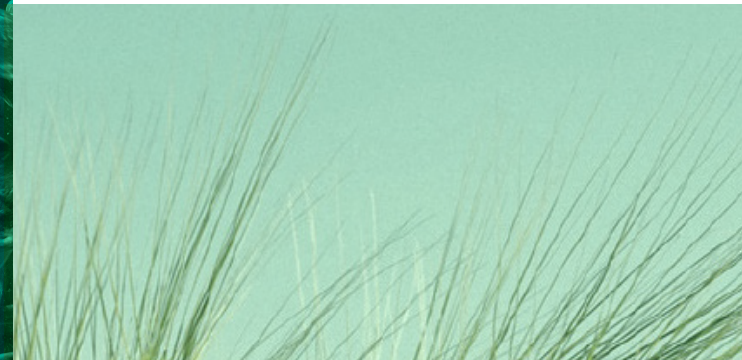

What is BSAS?

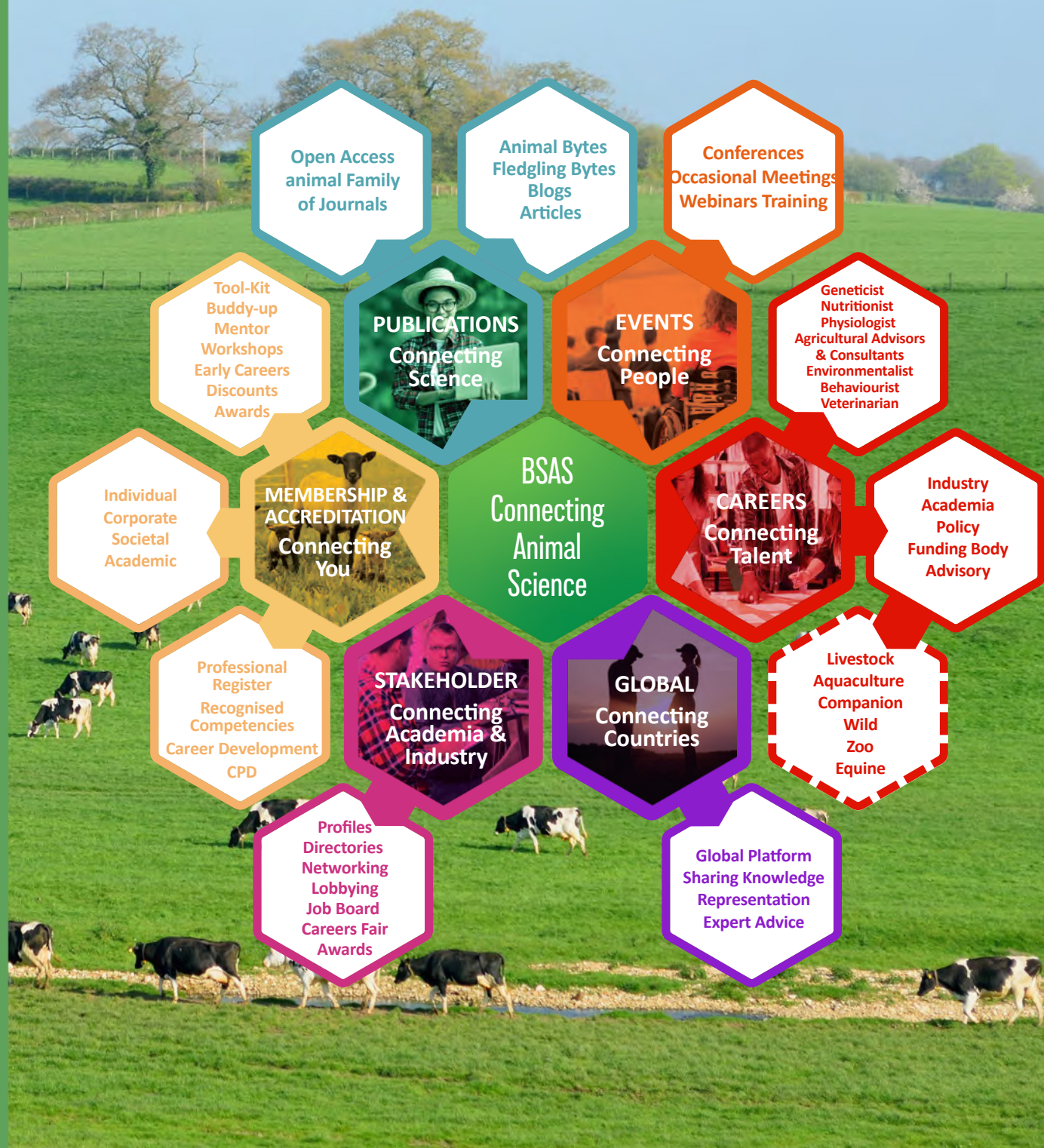
The British Society of Animal Science (BSAS), established in 1944, is a charity which is dedicated to supporting animal science in the UK and Ireland. The society covers all aspects and application of animal science from livestock, companion animals, equine, zoo species, agriculture and aquaculture and represents all sectors, including research and academia, knowledge transfer, as well as applications of work within industry.

Through its committees and diverse, growing membership, BSAS, as a charity, provides improvements in:

- The welfare and productivity of farmed animals to help produce quality, safe and environmentally sustainable food.
- Animal health and welfare and the care of equine, companion and zoo animals.

The British Society of Animal Science unlocks opportunities for networking and development across all species and specialisms because our rich membership represents the range and variety of all aspects of animal science and technology both in academia and industry.

80 years of history!

Nineteen-forty-four, the year of the foundation of The British Society of Animal Production, and the early years that followed, were filled with urgent opportunity – these were the post-war hunger years and the beginnings of the second agricultural revolution. The time was ripe for research and development in Animal Science.

In 1995, the British Society of Animal Production passed at its AGM a resolution to change the name of the Society to the British Society of Animal Science. This was not as revolutionary as it appears. It was an inevitable reflection of what had come to be the fact-of-the-matter. For good or ill, the primary focus of much (but by no means all) of the membership was no longer the ‘production’, but the ‘science’.

Early Career Opportunities

BSAS Register

The BSAS Professional Register is an accreditation system for Animal Scientists and Animal Technologists, recognizing expertise and professional competence. It provides professional recognition, supports career development, and enables members to track Continued Professional Development (CPD) to maintain their accredited status. Accredited professionals are listed in a public register, helping to demonstrate their skills to employers, collaborators, and funding bodies. Accreditation is open to all those working in the animal sciences, including food production, animal welfare, equine, companion animals, and zoo animals across academia, industry, and government. Successful applicants earn the designation R. Anim. Sci. or R. Anim. Technol., marking their status as registered professionals.
